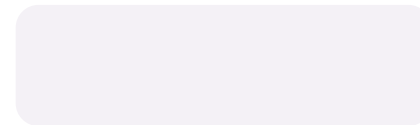

Information for Customs/ Security staff

This patient is carrying Remsima® which contains the active ingredient infliximab, which is a prescription medicine used to treat various inflammatory conditions.

It is not a narcotic or controlled agent.

Remsima® is administered subcutaneously (injected under the skin) using a pre-filled pen or syringe.

Remsima® must be stored in a refrigerator at 2°C to 8°C and should not be frozen or exposed to light. The product may be stored outside the refrigerator at temperatures up to 25°C for up to 28 days.¹

Given the temperature sensitive nature of the medicine, **it is critical that the patient carries it with them in their hand luggage.**

Tips for travel with medication

- Ask your healthcare provider to prescribe enough Remsima® for the duration of your travel.
- Carry Remsima® with you in your hand luggage to prevent sudden temperature changes or baggage loss. If travelling to a warm region or country, get advice from your pharmacist about storing Remsima®.
- Call or visit the airline website to check if there are any specific rules for travelling with medication.
- If you are travelling overseas, please check if there are any specific rules for entering the country with medication.
- Remsima® Travel Kit will help you carry your device with reduced risk of damage or cracking when you travel. Always carry this card in the pocket inside Remsima® travel kit.
- Inform customs staff that you are carrying sharps and a sharps container.

Please note that interrupting treatment can seriously impact the patient's medical condition
